1. Birth and Death (20)

For every 100 girl babies who died in the first 27 days of life in 2018 127.5 boy babies died.

For every 100 girl babies who died after the first 27 days but in the first year of life 130 boy babies die.

For every 100 infant girls who died under one year, 128 infant boys died.

For every 100 girls ages 1 to 4 years who died 141 boys died.

For every 100 girls ages 5 to 14 years who die 130 boys die.

For every 100 girls and women ages 15 to 24 years who die 270 boys and men die.

For every 100 women ages 25 to 34 years who die 227 men die.

For every 100 women ages 35 to 44 years who die 177 men die.

2. Educational Attainment of Young Adults (4)

For every 100 women ages 25 to 29 years who have a master's degree, there are 63 men.

For every 100 women ages 25 to 29 years who have a first professional or doctor's degree there are 74 men.

For every 100 girls ages 3-17 years diagnosed with communication disorders (speech problems, language problems, voice problems) there are 168 boys.

For every **100 girls 3 to 5 years old** served by public schools under the "Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA)," there are **227 boys**.

For every 100 women who were victims of violent crimes in the past 10 years through 2021, there were 107 men.
